

## USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY EXCEPT WHERE LOCAL RULES PREVAIL

- White stakes and fences define out-of-bounds.
- Red stakes define lateral water hazards.
- All roads, cart paths and railroad ties are obstructions. When ties or other man-made objects border a sand bunker, they are considered obstructions within the bunker (Rule 24-2).
- All players must register in the Golf Shop and begin play on hole 1 unless otherwise authorized.
- Use the 90° rule unless instructed to remain on the cart path.
- Repair all ball marks and fill divots using the sand and seed bottle.
- The Club recommends and supports a 4-hour round of golf.
- The Country Club of Colorado is a non-metal spike facility.

*I*n 1967, Charles Gates purchased 3,000 acres of land in southwest Colorado Springs that was known as Cheyenne Mountain Ranch. He had a vision that included a community of individual homesites, shopping centers, restaurants, hotels and areas for recreation.
